***JOINT MEETINGS***

Regular meetings of the Ontario City Council, Ontario Housing Authority and Ontario Redevelopment Agency were held on Tuesday, June 17, 2008, in the Council Chambers, City Hall.

Notice of said meeting was duly given in the time and manner prescribed by law. Affidavit of compliance is on file in the Records Management Department.

***CALL TO ORDER***

The meetings were called to order at 6:37 p.m., by Mayor / Chairman Leon.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Council Member Wapner.

The Invocation was offered by *Ontario Police Chaplain Larry Enriquez*.

**PRESENT:** Council / Authority / Agency Members Alan D. Wapner; Sheila Mautz Jim W. Bowman; Mayor pro Tem / Vice Chairman Jason Anderson; Mayor / Chairman Paul S. Leon.

**ABSENT:** None.

Also present were City Manager / Executive Director Gregory C. Devereaux, City Attorney John Brown and City Clerk / Secretary Mary E. Wirtes.

***PUBLIC COMMENT***

Mayor Leon referred to an article in today's paper and indicated he will not discuss private issues in his life. He said he is here to conduct the business of the City.

*Loredana Nesci* spoke to the recent articles in the newspaper regarding the Mayor's personal affairs.

*Earl de Vries* said the first homosexual marriage was taking place today in San Bernardino and he requested support for the Protect Marriage Amendment on the

November ballot. He asked Council Members and the public to endorse the amendment indicating support can be shown on the internet site [www.protectmarriage.com](http://www.protectmarriage.com).

*Dale Briggs* referred to demolition taking place at the proposed Wal-Mart store site on Mountain Avenue and said he was advised there is no permit to do so. He contacted the City's Building Department and Police Department regarding the matter and was advised the Building Official verbally extended the permit. He said he feels the City is not enforcing regulations. Mr. Briggs was referred to staff for assistance.

*Daryl Vollrath* said he completed the Citizen's Academy at the Ontario Police Department and expressed appreciation to the teachers and officers for their hard work.

*Sylvester Brooks* expressed his concerns regarding the possibility of explosives entering the country on shipping lines that contain thousands of units and questioned the security in place.

*Dorene Hopkins* commented on "tent city", police checkpoints in Pomona, infrastructure improvements on East J Street, the need to reduce speed limits and the status of the Wal-Mart property. She urged citizens to register to vote and cast their ballot in the upcoming November election.

City Manager Devereaux clarified the City does not own the Wal-Mart property on Mountain Avenue as suggested, Wal-Mart does.

*Oz Fox*, lead guitarist for a Christian Rock Band named "Striper" spoke in support of Mayor Leon and his handling of personal difficulties.

City Manager Devereaux said there were no announcements.

### ***SECOND ANNUAL COMPASS BLUEPRINT RECOGNITION AWARD***

Council Member Mautz said she attended a recent Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) event and accepted on behalf of the City, the Compass Blueprint Award for the Town Center Project, which was presented at the Eighth Annual Regional Housing Summit. Council Members presented the award to Planning Director Blum who said this is the second year the City has received the award for achievement in visionary planning and spoke of working with SCAG to plan for an additional 2 ½ million people in the region. Council Members applauded the Planning Department.

PCUP02-007 – APPEAL OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION'S DECISION REVOKING A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT FOR DOS CORONAS RESTAURANT & BAR FOR LIVE ENTERTAINMENT IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE SALE AND ON-PREMISE CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES AND DISTILLED SPIRITS WITHIN A BONA FIDE RESTAURANT (APN: 1010-521-27)**

A public hearing to consider an appeal from the Planning Commission's decision to revoke the Conditional Use Permit (File No. PCUP02-007) for Dos Coronas Restaurant & Bar for live entertainment in conjunction with the sale and on-premise consumption of alcoholic beverages and distilled spirits within a bona fide restaurant located at 305 North Mountain Avenue in the C3, general commercial, zoning designation. APN: 1010-521-27.

Notice of public hearing was duly given and affidavit of compliance is on file in the Records Management Department.

There were no written communications. Mayor Leon outlined the process to be followed on this matter stating staff will make a presentation, Council Members will have an opportunity to question and the matter will then be open to Public Comment.

Planning Director Blum described the property on the west side of Mountain Avenue south of D Street and related the long history and timeline of attempts to achieve compliance with municipal statutes. He gave a slide show presentation demonstrating the health and safety violations encountered and other code violations that have occurred. Planning Director Blum indicated the Planning Commission has conducted a public hearing and concluded that many violations could have been easily remedied but the owner repeatedly failed to correct violations prior to the deadline established by the Planning Commission.

Planning Director Blum then reviewed the appellant's appeal and the 5 points made in their brief. He concluded by saying that staff believes the claims made have not been substantiated by the appellant and recommended upholding the Planning Commission's decision to revoke the Conditional Use Permit (CUP).

Council Members discussed the matter including the cost to the City for resources employed to inspect and monitor the business and the potential for cost recovery. City Attorney Brown said staff will look into the matter as a separate action.

*Armando Chavira*, attorney for the appellant, addressed Council to indicate he did not receive the agenda packet in a timely manner and had not had a chance to review it. He requested adding two items to the points in their appeal including an allegation of selective enforcement against a class of businesses and individuals citing a process that targets Latin business owners and patrons. Mr. Chavira said the City receives grant funds from Alcohol and Beverage Control (ABC) to monitor these locations and would like an accounting of the level and use of these funds. He suggested that a pattern of selected enforcement was apparent and that the revocation of the CUP may violate federal and state codes including misuse of funds.

He referred to a proposed settlement that would help his client to vacate the business and relocate elsewhere and feels the City overreached and over penalized the business owner. He alleged ABC has investigated without issuing a violation. He argued for a suspension rather than a revocation of the Permit and said the settlement letter submitted should not have been provided to the Planning Commission.

City Attorney Brown said he was not happy with efforts to add two items not previously submitted and recommended limiting consideration to the 5 appeal points raised in the appellant's brief.

Mayor Leon asked whether anyone else wished to speak to this matter and, finding none, allowed Mr. Chavira an additional 3 minutes to sum up.

Mr. Chavira again referred to the agenda documents received earlier in the day and said he feels the two (2) points should be raised and preserved for appeal. He concluded by stating the business is not a nuisance to the neighborhood and feels a suspension of the Permit would be more appropriate. He said the owner is asking for time to leave and there have been no protests from anyone in the area. He requested 120 days at the planning level and not a revocation.

Planning Director Blum said the Planning Commission minutes clearly indicate the letter was not used as an admission of guilt on the appellant's part. He indicated Mr. Chavira stated he would pick up the agenda packet on Monday, but failed to keep the appointment. Staff then distributed the packet to the owner and faxed it to the Attorney. He said staff made every effort to get the information to him. Planning Director Blum said Mr. Chavira has acknowledged the violations and there is no evidence tonight to support claims of staff wrong doing. Staff recommends revocation.

No one else requesting to be heard, the Mayor closed the public hearing.

Council Members spoke briefly regarding their support of the decision of the Planning Commission based on public nuisance calls received from neighbors of the Dos Coronas Restaurant, safety issues observed and verified, the failure of the appellant to meet the burden of proof, the lack of new information or abuse of discretion,

establishment of due process in the matter, previous history of a suspension that did not correct the problems and efforts on the part of the City to work with the owner. Further discussion focused on the thorough review and a fair hearing provided in this matter, failure to show that selective enforcement is an issue and the need to uphold safety regulations in the public's interest.

#### **16. ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL TAX BONDS FOR COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 13 (CALIFORNIA COMMERCE CENTER - PHASE IV)**

Adopt a resolution authorizing the issuance of special tax bonds for Community Facilities District No. 13 (California Commerce Center – Phase IV). The resolution:

- A. Authorizes the issuance of special tax bonds for public improvements required to facilitate the development of the California Commerce Center – Phase IV project;
- B. Approves the forms of the Indenture of Trust, the Bond Purchase Agreement, the Continuing Disclosure Agreement, and the Preliminary Official Statement;
- C. Authorizes a negotiated sale of the special tax bonds to Wedbush Morgan Securities (the “Underwriter”) in accordance with the terms of the Bond Purchase Agreement;
- D. Authorizes the execution of the Indenture of Trust, the Bond Purchase Agreement, the Continuing Disclosure Agreement, and the Preliminary Official Statement by the City Manager, or his designee;

***COUNCIL / STAFF COMMENT***

He also thanked the Fire and Police Department staff who participated in the closing ceremonies and lined up on 1<sup>st</sup> base to congratulate the children.

Council Member Wapner said his daughter participated in a successful season of Fastpitch Baseball; he commended Dave Masterson who was present in the Chambers for his assistance to Edison Elementary school in their first production *Broadway Bound* at Edison Elementary School which was very successful.

City Manager Devereaux reminded members of the audience that fireworks are illegal in Ontario and a hotline has been established for reporting them. He said there is \$1,000 fine and people may call 988-3650 to report them.
